Tips for Ordering Products from the US Mint that Sell Out Quickly

I'm sure many of us have experienced the frustration of trying to order a very popular limited mintage product from the US Mint. Sometimes these products sell out within minutes. The Mint website can slow dramatically and finally indicate that the item is no longer available. Collectors can buy the items on the secondary market, but usually at much higher prices. An early order may also be important if you want to receive the coin in time to submit for a "first strike" or "early release" designation on the slab.

I've had reasonable success in ordering "hot" items from the mint before they sell out. I'll share some tips that will help you to successfully order popular items. There are no guarantees, but if you follow these suggestions your chances of success will increase.

Plan ahead. New products are almost always available for sale at 9AM Pacific Time (12 PM Eastern Time). The schedule of sales is usually available on the mint website a month or more in advance. Be sure you know what you want to order and are aware of any order limits.

Check in advance that your user ID and password work reliably. Register your payment choice in advance. This will save valuable time when the ordering period starts. The mint accepts credit cards and PayPal. Be sure your credit card will not expire soon so that if your purchase is back-ordered, it is not be canceled due to an expired credit card.

Practice placing an order ahead of time so that there are no surprises, preferably the night before. You can go through all of the steps except the final placement of the order without buying anything. Be sure to check the box for acceptance of the mint's terms of sale. If you plan on ordering other products that are available before the sale starts, put them in your shopping cart ahead of time.

Log onto the mint site 10 minutes before the sale starts. Navigate so that you are only 1 or 2 clicks from ordering the item you want. This is important, the website will get slammed with requests at 9AM and slow down dramatically. You don't want to waste time doing steps that you can do ahead of time.

If you have more than one computer, log onto your account with each computer. This increases your chance of success. Sometimes the mint site will stall on one computer but remain active on another. I have done this many times. Your account will maintain the same shopping cart and information on each computer. Just be sure to make the final purchase step on only one computer.

Start the ordering process exactly at 9AM. The trick is to place your order with a minimum number of keystrokes and clicks. Each extra keystroke or click increases the chances of a website slowdown, errors or a crash. I have found that I can order with PayPal with less clicks than with a credit card. Consider this as an option for popular items if you have a PayPal account.

At times the mint offers several new products at the same time, for example with new commemorative coins. If one coin is the "hot" product, consider ordering it immediately. You can go back and place another order for the less popular items. If you order at least 3 times in a year from the mint, you will be enrolled in their loyalty program and won't have to pay for additional standard shipping.

I have also tried placing a phone order on popular items a few times, but never with any success. Neither did I have success with the US Mint app on my iPhone for a sellout item.

If you are successful with your order, you should receive an email soon with an acknowledgment of the order and an order number. An order confirmation with all the details of your order will be sent up to an hour later.

Realize that there are no guarantees, and that even with all these techniques at times you may not be successful. You may be competing against people that are paid a premium by some firms to buy these products from the mint, which are then resold for larger premiums. I do not like these tactics because often they result in the end collector paying more than the mint prices.

Very often the prices of these sold-out items spike quickly, then slowly subside over months or years. At times the prices will drop below the mint prices. Consider how important it is to you to buy the item on the secondary market soon after the sellout. Often, but not always, you will get a better price by being patient and waiting.
