This second meeting of 2024 was called to order by President Dave Davis at precisely 7:00 pm. President Davis led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance to our national flag and welcomed all participants.


There were 40 people, mostly members, attending this meeting with one visitor and one guest present. The visitor's name was Del Miller from Martinez, a former coin shop owner from Los Angeles. He was so impressed with our coin club that he decided to become our newest member. Welcome aboard, Del! Our guest was Richard. I'm sorry Richard but I didn't get your last name, nor where you live. Maybe someone can help me with that one.

The On Time drawing was won by Neil Robertson and he received a 1907 (EF+) Indian Head Cent. By the way, Neil was also the presenter for this night's topic.

Treasurer Maria Stillwagon says the club has \$14,231.71 in the General Account and \$3,000.00 in the Coin Show Account. Not much change from the previous month.

Announcements were as follows:

- (1) Michael Turrini said our own Maria Stillwagon was invited to speak at the Nickel Gallery on the University of Calgary campus in Canada on April 26th and 27th. The topic will be on Invasion Currency. She will also be speaking at the Royal Canadian Numismatic Association's Convention in late July on the topic of Women in Numismatics. Congratulations Maria!
- (2) Dan DiCarlo had several flyers on upcoming coin shows, gem shows, and the Golden Gate Bottle Show. The Bottle show will be at the Contra Costa fairgrounds on April 20th.
- (3) Larry Casagrande talked about the San Jose and Cupertino Coin Shows.
- (4)) President Davis asked the membership if someone could take over bringing in the club refreshments.
- (5) Maria Stillwagon said there are new badges available for all the members to wear. This will show that the members have paid for their dues.
- (6) Bob Luna said there are new business club cards available for the members to hand out to their friends. Thanks Bob!



Due to technical difficulties with getting the PowerPoint ready, the Show & Tell event was done next. Eight members participated in this fun event:

- Manuel Cunha showed us some financial receipts from Eureka, CA that were made from 1888 to 1890,
- Michael Turrini showed us his 1889-CC Morgan silver dollar certified from PCGS in Good, G4, condition. He also showed us his 1967 British Gold Sovereign that was a Coca Cola prize in Quebec, Canada,
- Lloyd Chan showed us his well-worn Cleopatra bronze Egyptian coin that is around 2,100 years old, probably minted in Alexandria,
- Brad Lee brought in some 2023-P, and D Maria Tallchief American Women Quarters to show us and to hand out to all of the members present. Thanks Brad!
- Nicholas Tsakoyias brought in his 1888 British silver Crown coin,
- Raul Ramirez showed us his 1914 One Peso Mexican Treasury Banknote,
- Michael Ettner brought in his Franklin Mint Bossed British Stamps, and
- Kyle Anderson showed us his 1968 collection of bronze medals from the Shell Oil Company depicting the Presidents of the United States.

The Show & Tell prize of a 1944-D (EF) 20 Centavos Philippines silver coin went to Brad Lee.

After Show & Tell, Neil gave his presentation on <u>Coins & Social Media</u>. The DNS website has the title "<u>Instagram & On-Line Platforms</u>". He said the last five years has been good with a rise on social media coin talk primarily due to COVID-19. Social Media is mostly accessed through cell phones with advertising being the number one source of funding. He talked about the different types of social media where coin collecting is shared. They are Facebook, Twitter (X), Instagram, Tik Tok, Reddit, Discord, and Whatnot.

- (1) *Facebook* has the highest number of users talking about coin collecting; from buying to selling to trading to exchanging ideas. Beware of people who will take advantage of you by selling fake coins. There are virtual coin shows on Facebook.
- (2) *Twitter*, or X as it is now known, doesn't have much coin talk activity.
- (3) <u>Instagram</u> has more images and videos than the other platforms and tends to focus on the high end coin collector. There is some fraud here and it's not designed to sell coins. Larry said coin collecting is alive and well on Instagram. He says he has several followers.
- (4) *<u>Tik Tok</u>* is primarily based on the short form video format with not much on coin collecting.
- (5) <u>Reddit</u> has some talk on coins but it is more novice-based like "Look what I just found in my change! Does anyone know what it is?"
- (6) *Discord* is server-based which has a lot of talk on video gaming and hobbies like coin collecting of which there is some talk on.
- (7) <u>Whatnot</u> has a lot of coin shop live auctions going on with mainly common coins. Here you will find new collectors to our hobby and youth. As far as grading is concerned, Neil says these sites are based on virtual images of the coin and the grading is about 35% correct. He said to go to <u>mycollect.com</u> and try to grade coins using these virtual images. It can be tricky so beware! Thank you Neil for a great presentation!

There was a 15 minute break after the presentation. After the break, there was the 50/50 drawing that had a total amount of \$51. The winner was Raul Ramirez who received \$26 with our club getting the remainder of \$25.

Our coin drawing winners were Don Hill, 2x, Nick Tsakoyias, 3x, Dan DiCarlo, 2x, Karen Stephenson, Michael Turrini, and our newest member, Del Miller. The grand prize was a PCGS 1941 Mercury Head Dime graded Proof 66. This was won by Karen Stephenson.

Our next coin club program for March 21st will be our club's 64th anniversary celebration! There will be an open discussion on coin collecting and some comments from our past presidents. There will also be an anniversary cake, cookies, and drinks so come hungry and eager to talk. Bring a friend if you can.

The Membership drawing was won by Sherry Morgan who received a 1944-P PCGS (MS65) graded Jefferson War Nickel.

This February meeting was adjourned at 8:47 pm.

So come to a meeting and buy a shirt or two.


