1956 Proof Franklin Half Analysis

Mike Turrini asked me if this was a double-die coin, and I told him I needed to take a look at the coin under more magnification than my pocket magnifier has. I took the coin home; photographed the coin and them broke out the reference books. I could not find any evidence of doubling, but I did learn that there are two types of this coin based on the reverse dies that were used to produce theses proof coins.

You need to examine the Eagle's feathers to the left of the Eagle's perch. Type one proofs have four feathers to the left of the perch and type two proofs have three feathers to the left of the perch. As the photos show; this is a **type one**.

NGC's Key to Coin Preservation

Old holder collecting has become very popular in numismatics over the past 5-10 years. Collectors regular seek out coins graded in the 80s and early 90s as evidenced by their different styles of holders. Perhaps collectors think coins graded in the past will be graded more conservatively. Perhaps they think the best coins were graded first. Or maybe we all tend to value everything that's old. In any case, this goes against the fact that coin storage has improved over the last 30 years. NGC took a step towards better preservation when they introduced their "line" holder. They introduced a new holder design that has a ridge of plastic that protrudes into the white flexible coin insert that holds the coin and label. The insert itself has a female opening with the same contour as the plastic ridge. This creates a "key" like structure that creates more of a physical barrier between the label and the coin. The coin label itself is paper and contains ink. Both of those are things that have the potential to lead to coin toning over time. I continually observe coins in fatty holders that have toned over time while being in the holder. I don't see that level of toning on early lined holders that they started using in 1997, even though they were encapsulated at approximately the same time as the NGC holders without the key. Now that the "lined" holder has been in service for 25 years, the collector experience and the state of their encapsulated coins has validated NGC to update their holder back in 1997. Sometimes change is good!
