This Month in American Coin/Currency History:

01/15/1782 – U.S. decimal coinage system approved

01/18/1796 – First U.S. dimes struck

01/01/1866 – The motto *In God We Trust* appears on gold and silver coins, with the exception of the dime, which is too small.

01/27/1874 – Mint authorized to strike foreign coins

01/30/1934 – The Gold Reserve Act withdraws gold coins from circulation, provides for the devaluation of the dollar's gold content, and creates the Exchange Stabilization Fund.

01/13/1937 – The first shipment of gold is made to the new U.S. Bullion Depository at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

A new building opens for the San Francisco Mint, which has outgrown the "Granite Lady."

01/02/1959 – First production of the Lincoln memorial cents

01/02/1968 – Mint Marks restored to U.S. coins

01/06/1997 – Secretary Robert Rubin authorizes the Mint to produce the nation's first platinum coins.

01/18/2000 – The Sacagawea Golden Dollar is released into circulation.

01/02/2001 – New York State quarter released.

01/02/2002 – Tennessee State quarter released.

The United States Mint celebrates its 210th birthday!

01/02/2003 – Illinois State quarter released.

01/26/2004 – Michigan State quarter released.

01/31/2005 – California State quarter released.

01/31/2006 – Nevada State quarter released.

01/29/2007 – Montana State quarter released.

01/28/2008 – Oklahoma State quarter released.

01/26/2009 – District of Columbia Quarter released.
